The technology lab is a hands on multiple-learning styles curriculum. This means that there will not be any assigned homework. If the student needs to make up work, they need to schedule time with the teacher after school to make it up. Students will spend 4 days working on each mission, three days working on learning about and working with the technology, and the fourth day they will take a test over what they learned.

I am participating in a pilot program this year called “Effective Grading Practices.” I will be separating grades into two parts; content knowledge and Work habits. Content knowledge will consist of the grades earned on assignments and team work. The team work grade is not a group grade, rather an individual grade based on how well the individual participates in the team. I grade using total points earned and these points will be used for the traditional GPA calculated grade.

Work habits will be assessed separately from the content knowledge grade using the Effective Grading Practices pilot program. See attached explanation.

I do not offer Extra Credit.

Students will need to bring paper and Pencil to class every day, along with their Agenda Book and Conduct Card.
