

Andover Public Schools - Meal Price Increase

Beginning with the 2008-09 school year, the price for a school meal in the Andover school district will increase by \$.15 per meal. With the last meal price increase occurring in 2001, the district has worked hard to control costs while maintaining a quality program for the students. Record-high energy and grocery prices in the past year have led to this increase.

Also, the price for school milk will be \$.40 for a carton of milk. This \$.05 price increase is in response to higher milk prices as quoted by district milk supplier, Hiland Dairy. Dairy market forecasters are warning that consumers can expect an even sharper increase in milk prices. Higher costs of transporting milk to market and increased demand for corn to produce ethanol get the blame.
